Getting Started

Going Deeper

Try reading a Harmony of the Gospels to see how our passage fits / relates to the **Sermon on the Mount** recorded in Matthew chapters 5-7. What things are similar? Different? What stands out to you? What's your take on this?

What impressed you from our passage? Share your thoughts and observations with your group.

Read Matthew 7:15-8:1. What light does this shed upon our passage in Luke? Who are the primary people who are claiming a relationship with Jesus/God, but not doing what He says?

Discuss the double-edged principle of leadership:

- 1. Students rarely advance beyond the level of their teacher.
- 2. 2. As a teacher, you can't give what you don't have. You can't take someone somewhere you've never been.

<u>John Maxwell</u> calls the previous point/principle The Law of the Lid. How have you seen this principle played-out in your life, or in your experience.

Talk about how successful spiritual leadership should point us to Jesus, should lead us to Christ. Have you been fortunate to experience this?

How can sin cloud our vision and distort our perception of others?

Read Matthew 15:7-14. How had the Pharisees and scribes become spiritually blind? What was the result? How can we guard against this in our own life?

Why is it important to look for fruit in leaders? What should be the fruit of a good leader? Read Romans 2:17-23. What does it mean to *teach ourself*?

What's your takeaway from the parable of the man who built on the rock vs. the guy who built upon the sand? What can we learn from this? What's the most practical way that we can build our life upon the Rock?
