Getting Started

Going Deeper

Re-read Luke 8:16-21. Try reading the NASB (New American Standard Bible) version and then the NLT (New Living Translation). What stands out to you? What differences do you see?

What stood out to you in our passage? Share your thoughts and observations with your group.

In your opinion, how does reading/viewing our passage as a continuation of the previous passage, rather than a completely new topic, change the way that we interpret our text? Try and give some examples.

What has been your experience in listening to God's Word? Excitement? Engagement? Distraction? Struggle? Disinterest? Indifference? Try and be honest. Explain what factors/experiences in your life have contributed to your present state.

How does the condition of our heart (the soil) change/affect the way that we listen to/receive God's Word (the Seed)?

Why is <u>how</u> we listen so important (vs. 18)? What can change <u>how</u> we listen? What can we actively do?

Discuss the following quote from the sermon:

"It's a serious thing to hear and understand the Word of God, because we have the responsibility of sharing it with others. Everyone who receives the seed (the Word) becomes a sower, a lightbearer, and a transmitter of God's Truth!"

Read 1 Thessalonians 1:5-8 in the New Living Translation and talk about it in light of the previous quote.

Remind yourself of the description of the Good Seed in verse 15 (Lk. 8:15). What does it mean to *cling to* (NLT) or *hold fast to* (NASB) God's Word?

Read the following verses: Romans 12:9; 1 Corinthians 15:2; Hebrews 3:6, 14; 4:14; 10:23; Revelation 2:25; 3:11. What light / perspective do these verses shed on what it means to cling to or hold fast to God's Word?

In your opinion, what does it mean to have *spiritual roots*? Is there anything that we can do to develop roots?

Application

What's one way that you can practice what you've learned?
