Who are some of the *needy at our gates* within Ventura? What can we do to help them? Do you know any of these people personally? Start by asking their name & taking the time to hear their story.

What are some ways that we can demonstrate **compassion** for the disadvantaged of Ventura County?

Read and discuss the following verses: Proverbs 19:17; 21:13 & 28:27

How has your salvation changed you? What difference has Christ's resurrection made in your life? What are some ways that other people would know this?

How can we persist in our advocacy for the disadvantaged?

Read the following verses that talk about the bold & confident access we have to God: Ephesians 3:12; Hebrews 4:14-16 & Hebrews 10:19-22. How can we use our position of privilege to intercede for those less fortunate than us?
