Discuss the following quotes as you begin your group discussion:

Prayer is the precise point where these themes converge."

"Prayer is not a weapon in our arsenal for fighting spiritual battles. Prayer is the battle!" -Daniel Henderson What's the context of our passage? How should we understand Jesus' teaching on prayer? (clue: verse 8)

What does the first story in our passage (vss. 1-8) teach us about prayer?

Discuss the following sermon quote:

"What if the time we spend in prayer represents the spiritual battle we're engaged in rather than the amount of time it takes to get God's attention?"

What does the second story in our passage (vss. 9-14) teach us about prayer?

Talk about the following sermon quote:

"Our confidence comes not in ourselves, but rather in the One we're addressing! There's no place for self-righteousness! It's all about His righteousness!"

How can we be expectant in prayer?
