### **Going Deeper**

Re-read Psalm 139. Try comparing two different translations. Was there anything surprising or new that you learned from the sermon? What was most meaningful or significant for you? Why?

# "Most people only know us to the degree that we want them to know us!"

Do you agree/disagree with this? Why? Start your group time by talking about what it means to be known. What do you appreciate most about being known by those who know you best? Talk about a time when you withheld information about yourself in a relationship. What was your motive/fear?

Discuss the following Tim Keller quote:

"To be loved but not known is comforting but superficial. To be known and not loved is our greatest fear. But to be fully known and truly loved is, well, a lot like being loved by God. It is what we need more than anything. It liberates us from pretense, humbles us out of our self-righteousness, and fortifies us for any difficulty life can throw at us!"

What do you appreciate most about God's *omniscience* (all-knowing ability)? What part of verses 1-6 was most meaningful to you? Why?

How should God's **omniscience** lead us to <u>freedom</u> rather than <u>fear</u>?

How does God's *omnipresence* (ability to be everywhere) and *omnispection* (ability to see everything) contribute to His *omniscience*?

Talk about the wonder that's expressed in verses 13-16! Which verse/part do you appreciate most?

Use verses 23-24 to close your group (or individual) time in prayer. Note: <u>know</u> here can also mean "<u>declare</u> or <u>teach</u>." And, <u>see</u> (vs. 24) can also mean "<u>determine</u> or <u>expose</u>."

## **Application**

What is God revealing about your heart? What does it mean for you to follow His lead today? What steps will you take? Who will hold you accountable & encourage you?
