

Opening Discussion

1. How do you feel working with people outside your generation?
 - What do you enjoy about it, and what can be challenging?
2. How have you experienced community at CBC?
 - What was it like when you first came, and what is it like now?
3. Of our three focuses—**intentional, intergenerational, and inclusive**—which feels strongest at CBC, and which needs the most growth?

Read Judges 2:6–15

4. In your own words, what happens in this passage?
 - Why did the next generation not know the Lord?
 - How can we prevent this kind of spiritual drift today?

Read Psalm 78:1–8

5. What commands or action verbs do you notice in these verses?
 - What is the Psalm calling us to do, and why?
 - Why does Moses (in a similar message) stress loving God with all our heart, soul, and strength?
6. As we reflect on developing the next generation:
 - What are some ways CBC is already doing this well?
 - What are some ways we could improve?
 - How could *you personally* be involved in this vision?

Read Deuteronomy 6:1–9

7. What stands out to you in these verses?
 - What is Moses asking of the Israelites?
8. What are some effective ways parents teach their kids about God’s faithfulness?
9. How can we, as a church family, support kids and young adults whose parents don’t share their faith?
10. How does remembering God’s faithfulness help us live out our own faith?

Reflection & Application

11. Who has helped you grow spiritually?
 - How did they impact you?
 - Do you currently have people who encourage and challenge your faith?
 - Who could you pursue to build that kind of support?
12. Earlier this quarter, we talked about *investing in others*.
 - How has that been going for you?
 - If you haven’t started yet, who could you begin investing in?
13. Spend some time brainstorming together how each person in the group could mentor or invest in others.
 - What strengths do you see in each person that could bless someone else?
